India' Cleanest City Indore Declared as 1st Water Plus City of India


The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has declared Indore, Madhya Pradesh, the cleanest city of India, as the 1st 'water plus' city of India.

- Indore received the 1st Swachh Certification of Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) Water Plus from the MoHUA under the Swachh Survekshan 2021.
- It is a certificate provided by the MoHUA to a city for maintaining cleanliness in rivers and drains of its administration.
- A city/ward/circle/zone could be declared as Water Plus only if all wastewater released from households, etc. is treated before releasing it to the environment.
- The certification of SBM Water Plus is valid for 6 months and the certificationprocess needs to be carried out every 6 months.

DRDO successfully Test fires Technology Cruise Missile



Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully test fired the Indigenous Technology Cruise Missile (ITCM) with a new Made-in-India Turbofan Engine 'Manik' from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) in Odisha.

- The missile flew for around 150 km with an indigenous cruise engine.
- The missile has been designed and developed by DRDO. It is an Advanced version of NirbhayMissile - a Subsonic Cruise Missile.
- This is the 1st successful test firing with the indigenous booster engine 'Manik', after the previous unsuccessful attempt in October, 2020.

Manik Engine

The Manik engine has been designed and developed by DRDO's Gas Turbine Research Establishment in Bengaluru. It will pave the way for development of different versions of the engine and longrange cruise missiles.

Niti Aayog Releases Handbook to Guide EV Charging Infrastructure in India



The Handbook named 'Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Implementation' was released by NITI Aayog. The objective of the book is to provide guidance to the state governments and local bodies about policy making and setting up of norms related to charging networks for Electric Vehicle (EV).

 It has been developed by NITI Aayog in association with the Ministry of Power (MoP), Department of Science and Technology (DST), Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) and World Resources Institute (WRI) India.

Key Points:

It aims to enhance charging infrastructure and boost electric mobility of vehicles in India.

- It provides technological framework, support and government funded structures to aid the EV charging facilities. It addresses the challenges associated with EV and suggests ways to tackle them.
- Target India has set an ambitious goal of increasing the Electric Vehicle numbers to 30% by 2030.

The Installed Renewable Energy Capacity of India Crossed 100 GW

The total installed renewable energy capacity in India, excluding large Hydro, has crossed the milestone of 100 GigaWatts (GW). With this, India holds 4th position in the world in terms of installed Renewable Energy (RE) capacity, 5th in solar and 4th in wind in terms of installed capacity. Target-100 GW achievement is considered to be part of India's target of 450 GW of renewable

energy capacity by 2030, increasing 25 GW every year and it will reach 146 GW installed RE capacity if we include large hydro projects.

Key points:

India has achieved power generation capacity of 383.73 GW excluding hydro).

- Allocation of RE capacity such as 50 GW is under installation and 27 GW is open fortendering purposes.
- Solar and wind generation recorded a high growth of 43.1 GW in 2021.
- India plans to reduce its carbon footprint by 33-35 % from its 2005 levels by 2030 and meet 40% of its electricity needs from non-fossil fuel sources by then, as part of its commitments to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change adopted by 195 countries in Paris in 2015.



Chandrayaan-2 Orbiter Detects Presence of Water Molecules on Moon



The Imaging Infrared Spectrometer (IIRS) instrument on the Chandrayaan-2 lunar orbiter has detected the presence of both Hydroxyl ions (OH) and Water Molecules (H2O) on the surface of the moon.

- The findings will be crucial for future planetary exploration for resource utilization and have been published in the journal 'Current Science'.
- It is authored by Former ISRO Chairman AS Kiran Kumar.
- ISRO's Chandrayaan-2 mission was launched in 2019.

Bhupender Yadav, Union Minister of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, released the Elephant & Tiger Population Estimation Protocol on the occasion of the World Elephant Day 2021 (12th August), which was celebrated at Indira ParyavaranBhawan, New Delhi.

- This protocol is to be adopted in the All-India elephant and tiger populationestimation exercise in 2022.
- For the first time, The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC) is converging Elephant and Tiger population estimation exercise.

ISRO's GSLV F-10 rocket fails to put EOS-03 Satellite into Orbit

Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) Largest Launch Vehicle Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV) F-10 rocket failed to put Earth Observation Satellite (EOS-03) satellite (also known as GISAT-1) into the Geosynchronous orbit. It was launched from Satish Dhawan Space Center (SDSC), Sriharikota in Andhra Pradesh.

- The mission failed due to a technical anomaly in the cryogenic upper stage ignition.
- The mission is the 1st flight of GSLV with Ogive Payload fairing which can accommodate larger payloads.
- ISRO to launch Bhutan's INS-2B satellite into space by December 2021
- Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) targets to launch Bhutan's INS-2B satellite into space by December, 2021. It will be a joint collaboration between India and Bhutan

 The satellite will be used to map Bhutan's natural resources and for disastermanagement.

MoEF&CC notifies Plastic Waste Management Amendment Rules 2021 to Prohibit Single Use Plastic Items by 2022

On August 13,2021, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6,8 and 25 of Environment (Protection) Act 1986, (29 of 1986), the Central Government amended the Plastic Waste Management (PWM) Rules, 2016 with Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2021.

These new rules were notified by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) prohibits the identified single use plastic items with low utility and high littering potential w.e.f. July 1, 2022.

With effect from September 30, 2021, the thickness of plastic carry bags has been increased from 50 microns to 75 microns.

In August 2021, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change announced the addition of 4 more wetlands from India, 2 each from Gujarat and Haryana in 'The Convention on Wetlands of International Importance'/ Ramsar Convention. Key Points:

Ramsar sites that are included:

- Thol Lake Wildlife Sanctuary, Gujarat
- Wadhvana Wetland, Gujarat
- Sultanpur National Park, Gurgaon, Haryana
- Bhindawas Wildlife Sanctuary, Jhajjar, Haryana With this, the number of Ramsar sites in India became 46 and the surface area covered by the Ramsar sites became 1,083,322 hectares.
- Haryana got its 1st Ramsar sites and Gujarat's total sites count reached 3

(along with Nalsarovar, which was declared in 2012).

India. EAC sign Action Plan to Boost Trade

A Joint Action Plan was signed between India and East African Community (EAC) to boost trade activities and faster clearance of goods of both the parties. It was signed during a virtual ceremony.

- The signing of the agreement will lead to a full Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA) between the two sides.
- India has been selected as a partner due to the principle of Mutual Recognition \& Steady trade between EAC and India. Over the past five years (2014-2018), before the Covid-19 disruptions, trade between the two entities amounted to over USD 30 billion.
- The MRA once realised, will benefit companies under the Authorised Economic Operators (AEO) Programme run by the EAC Partner States. AEO is a programme run by EAC countries based on Principle of Mutual recognition and fair-trade practices.

Indian Javelin Thrower Neeraj Chopra was ranked 2nd (up from 16) in the recently released World Athletics Men's Javelin Throw Ranking 2021. Neeraj was also ranked 129th in the Men's Overall Athletics Ranking.

 Neeraj Chopra won Gold Medal in Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

- Germany's Johannes Vetter (World No. 1) continued to be Number 1 in the Men's Javelin Throw Ranking.
- The World rankings for Athletics are issued by the Sport's governing body 'World Athletics'.

Neeraj Chopra Neeraj Chopra was born in Panipat, Haryana. His Gold Medal is India's 1st Medal in a Track & Field event.

- He threw the Javelin to a distance of 87.58, to win the Gold Medal.
- Overall, it is only India's 2nd individual Gold Medal in an Olympics. India's 1st individual Gold Medal was won by Abhinav Bindra in 10m Air Rifle at the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

President gives Assent to 'The Taxation Laws (Amendment) Bill 2021'

President Ram Nath Kovind has given assent to the 'The Taxation Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2021' which amends the Income Tax Act, 1961 (IT Act) and the Finance Act, 2012.

Objective of Bill - To nullify retrospective tax provision & end retrospective taxes

imposed on Indirect Transfer of Indian Assets made before May 28,2012.

The Bill was introduced by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in the Lok Sabha asa Money Bill.

Key Points:

The Finance Act, 2012 amended the IT Act, 1961 to impose tax liability on income earned from sale of shares of a foreign company on a retrospective basis. The new bill aims to nullify the retrospective basis for taxation.

- Retrospective tax means to pay tax for goods and services purchased in the past or income earned in the past.
- The bill will nullify tax liability imposed on persons if they fulfil certain set conditions.

Kaziranga Becomes India's 1st National Park with Satellite Phones Facility

Kaziranga National Park of Assam became India's first National park to be equipped with satellite phones, an initiative to boost anti-poaching measures in the park. Jishnu Barua, Chief Secretary of Assam presented 10 satellite phones to forest personnel at the National Park.

- The meeting chaired by Dr HimantaBiswaSarma Chief Minister (CM) of Assam decided to provide the satellite phones to the forest personnel of the park.
- The 10 satellite phones were procured by the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) at an estimated cost of Rs lakhs.
- The Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL) will be the service provider.

Tata Power Solar receives 50MW Solar PV & 50Mwh Battery Storage Project in Leh, Ladakh

Tata Power Solar, a wholly owned subsidiary of Tata Power has received projects worth INR 386 crore to build a 50MWp Solar Photovoltaic (PV) Plant and 50 Mwh Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) project in Phyang village of Leh, Union Territory of Ladakh.

- The project will be India's 1st colocated large scale BESS solution and 1 stlarge scale solar project in the UT of Ladakh at a high altitude of 3600 metersabove mean sea level.
- It includes design, engineering, construction of Solar Photovoltaic grid

connected power plant and BESS along with 10 years of operations and maintenance services.

• The project is expected to be completed by March 2023.

Amolopsadicola: New Species of Cascade Frog Discovered from Arunachal Pradesh



Indian and American Biologists from Delhi University, Wildlife Institute of India and North Carolina Museum of Natural Science (USA) have discovered a new species of Cascade Frog from Adi Hills of Arunachal Pradesh. The species is named Amolopsadicola (Adi Cascade Frog) after the Adi Hills, the home of Adi tribes, an indigenous people from the Himalayan region of Arunachal Pradesh.

 The details of the discovery are published as "Phylogenetic position of the poorly known montane cascade frog Amolopsmonticola (Ranidae) and description of a new closely related species from Northeast India" in the Journal of Natural History.

About Amolopsadicola:

- Amolopsadicola belonging to the genus Amolops, is a brown colour frog of size ranging from 4 to 7 cm.
- The new species was identified based on its external morphology, DNA and distinct calling pattern.
- The genus amops is one of the largest groups of ranid frogs (family ranidae), which has around 73 known species located across the Northeast and North India, Nepal, Bhutan, China and Malay peninsula.

Note:

The study resolved the taxonomic confusion around the identification of another cascade frog species.

India finalizes deal with Russia to buy AK-103 Rifles under Emergency Procurement



On August 20,2021, India finalized a deal with Russia for the procurement of a sizeable number of AK-103 series of assault rifles for the Indian Army under the provisions of emergency financial powers granted to the three services to make urgent purchases.

- This deal is on the lines of the mega infantry modernization programme by the Indian Army for the replacement of its ageing and obsolete weapons with a large number of light machine guns, battle carbines and assault rifles.
- No specification on the number of rifles or the cost of procurement has beenprovided.

Background:

- In October 2017, the Indian Army began the process to acquire around 7 lakh rifles, 44,000 light machine guns (LMGs) and nearly 44,600 carbines to further enhance the combat capability of the Army. Points to be noted:
- September 2020, Ministry of Defence and Russian representatives inked a major deal for manufacturing -6 lakh AK-47 rifles in India un203 'Make-in-India' rifles under programme. These will be manufactured by the Indo-Russia Rifles Pvt. Ltd, a joint venture between the Ordnance Factory Board Kalashnikov Concern (OFB), the (manufacturer of the AK rifles) and Rosoboronexport, the Russian state agency formilitary exports.
- The AK-47 203 is the latest and most advanced version of the AK-47 rifle, which will replace the Indian Small Arms System (INSAS) 5.56 \times 45 mm assault rifle that are currently in use with the Army, Navy and the Air Force.

India's first SMOG Tower inaugurated by Arvind Kejriwal in Delhi

India's first smog tower launched in Delhi as a pilot project by the Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal at Baba Kharak Marg, Connaught Place. It was developed by IIT-Delhi and IIT-Bombay.

Objective - To improve the air quality. Nodal Agency - Delhi Pollution Control Committee(DPCC).

About the Smog Tower:

- The new tower- It is about 20m tall, set up to improve the air quality in a radius of around 1 km.
- Financial Outlay-The tower was built at the cost of INR 20 crores, which was financed by the government of Delhi.
- The towers have 1200 air filters which are developed by experts of University of Minnesota of the United States.

Working Process:

- A total of 40 fans have been installed at the bottom of the tower. Air will be suckedin from the top of the tower, filtered and released through the fans at the bottom.
- IIT-Delhi and IIT- Bombay were the technical advisors for the project. The Performance Report on a monthly basis will be presented by the scientists of Delhi Pollution Control Committee(DPCC).
- This smog tower has the capacity to purify 1000 cubic metres of air per second and it is estimated that it will reduce PM2.5 concentration by around 70 %.

Finance Minister Nirmala • Sitharaman launched National Monetisation Pipeline

Minister of Finance and Corporate Affairs, Nirmala Sitharaman launched the asset monetisation pipeline of Central ministries and public sector entities named National Monetisation pipeline (NMP).

- The NMP report was developed by NITI Aayog (National Institution for Transforming India) in consultation with infrastructure line ministries.
- **Objective:** To list out the government's (govt) infrastructure assets that are to be sold in the next 4 years.
- The aggregate monetisation potential under NMP through core assets of the central govt over the 4-year period (i.e. from FY22 to FY25) is estimated at Rs 6 lakhcrores.
- Monetisation: It is the process of earning revenue from an asset business by converting the assets into cash or a form that is easily convertible into cash.

The Government of India (GoI) has launched a rescue mission named 'Operation Devi Shakti' to evacuate stranded Indians from the Taliban-Captured Afghanistan.

- The operation is carried out by the Indian Air Force (IAF), Air India & the officials at the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) in collaboration with the US and several other countries.
- India has evacuated more than 800 people so far, since the Taliban captured Afghanistan.

Recent Developments in Afghanistan:

 Taliban has taken control of Afghanistan nearly 20 years after the US led military alliance left the country.Amrullah Saleh, Afghanistan's 1st Vice President declared himself as the caretaker president of Afghanistan, after former President Ashraf Ghani fled the country.

Operation Blue Freedom: An Expedition by Divyangjans to World's Highest Battlefield

In August 2021, the Union Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment Virendra Kumar flagged off 'Operation Blue Freedom', a world record expedition by Divyangjans (people with disabilities) from across India to the world's highest battlefield - Siachen Glacier (Kumar Post).

- The expedition team was trained by 'Team CLAW', a team of Armed Forces veterans.
- The battalion headquarters on the Siachen glacier located close to an altitude of 16, 000 feet is named 'Kumar post' to honour Colonel Narinder 'Bull' Kumar, who played a major role in Operation Meghdoot and securing the Siachen Glacier in 1984.

Land Degradation; the most pressing environmental problem of India; Findings Released by ISRO

In accordance with the findings in 'Desertification and Land Degradation Atlas of India' released by Indian Space

Research Organisation (ISRO), land degradation is the most pressing environmental problem of India.

- Almost 30 % of India's geographical area is already affected as all Indian states have recorded an increase in degraded land in the past 15 years mainly in northeastern states.
- These findings are premised upon the data from 2018-19.

Key Figures:

- Currently, 97.85 million hectares (mha) of land, an area 2.5 times the size of India's largest state Uttar Pradesh, has already been degraded. Of this, 3.32 mha an area 22 times the size of Delhi has been added in the 15 years between 2003-05 and 2018-19.
- Rajasthan, the most degraded state, along with Uttar Pradesh and Telangana, have seen a reduction in their degraded land in the last 15 years.
- Rajasthan, which accounts for almost 22 per cent of thedegraded land in the country, reclaimed almost 388,000 ha, an area roughly 2.6 times the size of Delhi. Uttar Pradesh(285,665 ha) and Telangana

(19,974 ha) together reclaimed degraded land twice the size of Delhi during the period.

Among the most degraded states Rajasthan is followed by Maharashtra and Gujarat.

Key Reasons behind Degradation:

- Water erosion is the most common reason (80%) for degradation of nonirrigated farmland, followed by wind erosion (17 %), salinity / alkalinity in land (2 %) and water logging (1 %)
- In order to become land degradation neutral by 2030, as announced by the Prime Minister in September 2019 at the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), India needs to face extreme challenges.

OneWeb launches 34 Satellites into LEO



OneWeb, Satellite Communications Operator Co-owned by Bharti Airtel \& United Kingdom (UK) Government has launched another batch of \$\mathbf{3} 4\\$ Satellites into Low Earth Orbit (LEO) on August 22,2021.

 The launch was carried out by Arianespace, European Satellite launch Company with the Soyuz, Russian Rocket from the Baikonur Cosmodrome, Kazakhstan. It was the 5th launch of OneWeb satellites in 2021, thereby making a total of \$\mathbf{2 8 8}\$ Satellites in the Orbit.

Key Points

- OneWeb is aiming to launch a total of 648 satellites to provide high-speed internet connectivity to customers around the world (SpaceX's Starlink internet constellation is expected to have around 12,000 satellites).
- OneWeb resumed satellite launches in December, 2020 after emerging from bankruptcy protection with USD 1 billion in equity investment from a consortium of the British government and India's Bharti Enterprises.
- It has also received investment from Japan's Softbank and Eutelsat Communications. It is now fully funded and has secured USD 2.4 Billion in totalfrom investments.

32 % of India's coastline underwent erosion in 28 years, West Bengal worst affected: NCCR Report

In accordance with the recent technical report by the National Centre for Coastal Research (NCCR) under the Ministry of

Earth Sciences, 32% of India's coastline underwent sea erosion and 27 % of it expanded in a time span of 28 years i.e. between 1990 and 2018

- India's coastline is 6,631.53 kilometres long in which 2,135.65 kilometres faced erosion and 1,760.06 km expanded during this period. About 2,700 km of thecoastline is stable.
- This information was provided by ParshottamKhodabhaiRupala, Union Minister of Fisheries, Animal, Husbandry and Dairying in response to a question in the Lok Sabha.

Sea Erosion of coastline:

- The coastline of West Bengal is the most affected as 60 % of it underwent erosion during these 28 years.
- It is followed by Puducherry (56%);
 Kerala (41%); Tamil Nadu (41%);
 Andhra Pradesh (28%); Gujarat including Daman and Diu (26%);
 Odisha (26%); Karnataka (24%);
 Maharashtra (22\%); and Goa (19%).

Coast Expansion:

• The maximum expansion was seen in the coastline of Odisha with 51 %.

 It is followed by the coast of Andhra Pradesh (48%); Karnataka (26%); West Bengal (25%); Tamil Nadu (22%); Kerala (21%); Gujarat including Daman and Diu (20%); Goa (14%); Maharashtra (10%) and Puducherry (8%).

Key Points:

- The NCCR monitors shoreline changes along the Indian coast. It carried out a national shoreline change assessment mapping for Indian coast covering nine coastal states and two Union territories (UT) to provide information for coastal management strategy.
- The National Centre for Sustainable Coastal Management (NCSCM) under the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) and the Central Water Commission under the Union Ministry of Jal Shakti also undertake studies on shoreline changes and their impact.

Sweden's HYBRIT delivered world's 1st fossil-free steel to Volvo AB

Sweden's green steel venture HYBRIT had made the world's first customer delivery of steel produced without using coal and coke, to its truck-manufacturer Volvo \$A B\$ (Aktiebolaget Volvo) as a trial run. This steel is produced with 100 % fossil-free hydrogen.

- HYBRIT stands for Hydrogen Breakthrough Ironmaking Technology. This was the raw material used to manufacture the so-called 'green steel.
- Its full commercial production will begin in 2026.
- HYBRIT is a joint venture (JV) between Swedish steelmaker SSAB (SSABa.ST) which is a state-owned utility Vattenfall (VATN.UL) and miner LKAB (Luossavaara Kiirunavaara Aktiebolag).

Key Points:

This tech aims to replace coking coal with fossil-free electricity and hydrogen. It's smaller-scale serial production will start in 2022.

- Traditionally coking coal is required for ore-based steel making.
- SSAB accounts for 10 % of Sweden's and 7 % of Finland's carbon dioxide emissions. This development will cater to its completely fossil-free value chain. It will revolutionize an industry that accounts for around 8 % of global greenhouse gas emissions.
- Notably, hydrogen is a key part of the European Union (EU's) plan to reach net zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050.

Children living as Migrants or Refugees increased to 35.5mn in 2020: UNICEF Report

In accordance with the report titled 'Uncertain Pathways:

How gender shapes the experiences of children on the move' by the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), the number of persons living outside their birth country or citizenship reached a record high of 281 million in 2020, representing \$3.6 \%\$ of the global population.

 This number is increased among boys and girls younger than 18 years to 5 million in 2020. Among them 13 million (overa third) were refugees and asylum seekers.

Key figures:

- 10 million child refugees were displaced due to conflict and war. Around 5.1 million were boys and 4.9 million were girls.
- In this displacement scenario, boys outnumbered girls by 1.2 million or 6.7 % which is the largest difference ever recorded.
- In a year, there were almost 15 million new displacements or 41,000 each day.
- Nearly two-thirds of all international migrants in 2020 (including refugees) were born in middle -income countries. Only 13% were born in lowincome countries.

The Middle East and North Africa region is home to thelargest number of international child migrants with greatest gender imbalance.

 There are around 9 million child migrants living in theseregions in 2020 with 54.3 % of them being boys. At the end of 2020, an estimated 23.3 million girls and boys were living in displacement due to conflict, violence or natural disaster; 11.3 million were girls and 11.9 million wereboys.

Space X launched ants, avocados, robot to ISS

The SpaceX's Dragon spacecraft was launched from a recycled Falcon 9 rocket from the NASA's (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) Kennedy Space Center on Merritt Island, Florida carrying shipment of ants, avocados and a human-sized robotic arm toward the International Space Station (ISS).

- After the launch, the rocket's firststage booster returned and landed upright on SpaceX's newest ocean platform, named 'A Shortfall of Gravitas'.
- This was SpaceX's 23rd delivery towards the ISS in 10 years and 3rd launch for this particular booster.

Key Points:

- The Dragon carried more than 4,800 pounds (2,170kilograms) of supplies and experiments, and fresh food including avocados, lemons and even ice cream for the space station's seven astronauts.
- The Girl Scouts sent ants, shrimp and plants for experiments while University of Wisconsin-Madison scientists sent seeds from mouse-ear cress, a small flowering weed used in genetic research. There are also Samples of concrete, solar cells and other materials for research.
- There is also a robotic arm which is sent to the ISS. It is manufactured by a Japanese start-up to perform chores around the Station.

What is the International Space Station (ISS)?

It is a home to astronauts in the form of large spacecraft which orbits around the earth. Its objective is to do research which could not be done on earth. It has science labs from the United States (NASA), Russia (Roscosmos), Japan (JAXA) and Europe (ESA).

AMUL Ranks 18th and France's 'Lactalis' Tops in Rabobank 2021 Global Dairy Report

As per the 2021 's Global Dairy Top 20 report released by a Dutch multinational banking and financial services company Rabobank, the France based dairy major company - 'Lactalis' became the World's number 1 dairy company in terms of market capital. Lactalis replaced Switzerland's Nestle, which remained as the global leader in the dairy sector for decades.

- Notably, India's well known cooperative brand 'AMUL' under the cooperative body Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation (GCMMF) also was placed at the 18th position, from its previous 16th rank in 2020.
- Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation (GCMMF) has become the first Indian dairy Industry to spot in the global top 20 list released by Rabobank.

Notable points on Dairy Sector:

- India is the World's largest Milk producing country.
- New Zealand is the World's largest
 Milk exporter, while China is the top
 Milk importing country.

Findings of the report:

Among the Top 20 companies, there was a 0.1 % (in terms of USD) decline in 2021 compared to 2020, which is around 1.9 % decline in terms of Euro.

Rabobank in its annual 'Global Dairy Top 20report, also states that the decline in turnover is mainly due to slowed merger & acquisition activities in 2020 due to COVID-19.

Lactalis, positioned at 9th place in 2000 moved to 1st because of its special focus on Organic methods of dairy production. Between 2001 to 2020, the top 20 dairy companies have doubled their turnover, with an average annual growth of 3.8 %





 - The annual celebration of World Mosquito Day has been organized by the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine since the 1930 s.

- **Exp.** India Ratings (Ind-Ra) has projected the GDP growth rate for India for FY22 at 9.4%. Earlier Indi-Ra had projected the rate at between 9.1-9.6%
- **3.(d)** Delhi
- **Exp.** Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal will inaugurate the country's first smog tower on August 23, 2021, at Baba Kharak Singh Marg, Connaught Place.
- 4.(d) IIT-Roorke
- **Exp.** India has launched a tech platform named "UNITE Aware", in collaboration with the UN, for improving the safety and security of the UN peacekeepers.

7.(a) Vishakhapatnam

Exp. NTPC has commissioned the largest floating solar PV project in India of 25MW power on the reservoir of its Simhadri thermal station in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. This is also the first solar project to be set up under the Flexibilisation Scheme. This scheme was notified by the Government of India in 2018.

8.(c) World Bank

Exp. The World Bank has launched a new 'Cybersecurity Multi-Donor Trust Fund', to better roll-out cybersecurity development agenda in a systematic manner. World Bank has partnered with four countries, namely Estonia, Japan, Germany, and the Netherlands, to launch the fund.

9.(b) Kerala

Exp. Onam is the most revered and celebrated festival of Kerala, is celebrated every year by the Malayali community across the world. The 10-day long festival marks the beginning of harvest season as well as the appearance of the Vaman avatar of Lord Vishnu along with the homecoming of King Mahabali.

10.(d) Both a & b

Exp. UbharteSitaare fund has been set up jointly by Exim Bank and SIDBI. Exp. Minister of Finance and Corporate Affairs, Nirmala Sitharaman launched the asset monetisation pipeline of Central ministries and public sector entities named National Monetisation pipeline (NMP).

prestigious Congressional Gold Medal to Mahatma Gandhi is given posthumously in recognition of his promotion of peace and nonviolence. The medal is the highest civilian award in the United States.

30.(b) Maki Kaji

Exp. Maki Kaji, the creator of puzzle Sudoku passed away at the age of 69 years due to bile duct cancer. He was known as the father of Sodoku and was from Japan.

31.(a) Javelin Throw

Exp. At the ongoing Tokyo Paralympics 2020, India's greatest paralympian, Devendra Jhajharia won the silver medal in the men's javelin throw – F46 final event on August 30, 2021.

32.(b) Shooting

Exp. Indian paralympic shooter AvaniLekhara won the first gold medal for India at the Tokyo Paralympics 2020 in the women's 10m air rifle standing SH1 event.

33.(d) Trikand

Exp. The Indian Navy and the German Navy carried out a joint exercise in the Gulf of Aden near Yemen, in the Indian Ocean leg of Indo-Pacific Deployment 2021. The Indian Navy was represented by frigate "Trikand" while the German Navy was represented by frigate "Bayern"

34.(a) Bengali

Exp. Eminent Bengali writer Buddhadeb Guha, has passed away. He was the author of many notable works such as "Madhukari" (Honey Gatherer), "KoelerKachhe" (Near the Koel bird) and "SobinoyNibedon" (Humble Offering).
