MoHUA extends Timeline for Implementation of Smart Cities Mission to June 2023



O n December 2, 2021, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) extended the timeline for the implementation of the Smart Cities Mission (SCM) for all 100 participating cities to June 2023 due to the COVID-19 induced slowdown and other factors. The Mission was launched in the year FY2015-16 & set a target of five years i.e. FY2019-20.

- This decision is also based upon the recommendations made by NITI (National Institution for Transforming India) Aayog in August 2021.
- The information for the same was provided by Minister of State (MoS) Kaushal Kishore, MoHUA in a written reply to a question in the Lok Sabha.

Key Points:

- According to an earlier deadline, the cities were expected to complete their projects within five years of being selected under the SCM.
- The cities were selected from January 2016 to June 2018. MoHUA launched the SCM in June, 2015.

BDL and Indian Army sign Rs 474.41 crore contract to supply IGLA-1M missiles

B harat Dynamics Limited (BDL) and the Indian Army signed a contract worth Rs \$471.41\$ crore in New Delhi for the refurbishment of IGLA-1M missiles. After the Refurbishment, the missile will get a fresh lease life of ten years.

About IGLA-1M missile :

- Introduced by the Soviet Union in 1986, the IGLA-1M is an improved version of Igla manportable missile system.
- The Igla is a fire-and-forget, man-portable, shoulder-launched, short range Surface-to-Air Missile (SAM) to engage low flying fixedand rotary-wing aircraft and cruise missiles.

Key Points :

 BDL has built-up its in-house R&D (Research & development) capabilities primarily focusing on design and engineering activities.

- It is utilizing emerging technologies like Artificial Intelligence (AI) to develop futuristic weapons for the Armed Forces,

India-EU adopted Clean Energy and Climate Partnership 2021-2023

n December 1, 2021, the 9th India-EU (European Union) Energy Panel held which was co-chaired by Reenat Sandhu, the Secretary of India's Ministry of External Affairs (West), and Ms. Mechthild Worsdorfer, Deputy Director General for Energy, European Commission (EC).

During the meeting both sides agreed on a detailed work programme 2021-2023, to implement the 2016 India-EU Clean Energy and Climate Partnership. iii. The Energy Panel agreed on increased technical cooperation in the area of energy efficiency, renewable energy, green hydrogen, grid integration; storage power market design, interconnection, cold chain, and sustainable financing.

About European Union :

- It has 27 member states.
- It has 24 official languages.
- The United Kingdom (UK) withdrew from the EU on January 31,2020.

Indian Army Received Israel's Heron Drones for Deployment in Ladakh Sector



The Indian Army has received the advanced Heron Drones from Israel to boost the army's surveillance capabilities. The drones will be deployed in the eastern Ladakh sector.

The drones were received under the emergency procurement clause to monitor the Chinese activities in Ladakh sector.

- The acquisition of the drones under the emergency financial powers granted by Prime Minister Narendra Modi led the government to the Defence forces.
- Under these powers, the defence can buy equipment and systems worth Rs 500 crores to upgrade the war fighting capabilities.

Under this facility, The Indian army has also leased 2 Predator drones from the American Firm General Atomics.

India achieves target of 40% Power Generation Capacity from Non-Fossil Fuel Sources

In accordance with the ministry of new and renewable energy (MNRE), India has achieved the target of 40 % power generation capacity to 156.83 (Giga Watt) from non-fossil fuel sources in November 2021.

- Now, India's installed renewable energy (RE) capacity stands at 150.05 GW, while its nuclear energy-based installed electricity capacity is 6.78 GW.
- This 156.83 GW non-fossil fuels based installed energy capacity is 40.1 % of the total installed electricity capacity of 390.8 GW.
- According to the government, installed power capacity from non-fossil fuels will go up to 66 % by 2030. Also, India has already reached an emission reduction of 28 %.

Note :

 India announced to cut net carbon emissions to zero by 2070 at COP26 in Glasgow.

MoS E&IT Rajeev Chandrasekhar Released the National Strategy on Blockchain, Launches India's 1st Indigenous Server RUDRA

O n 3rd December 2021, while celebrating Azadi Ka Digital Mahotsav, the Minister of State (MoS) for Electronics and Information Technology (IT) \& Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Rajeev Chandrasekhar, released the National Strategy on Blockchain.

- The National Strategy on Blockchain was formulated by the Ministry of Electronics \& Information Technology (MeitY) to create trusted digital platforms through shared Blockchain infrastructure.
- The strategy document would provide the guidance for creating a nationwide ecosystem for creating the National Blockchain Platform and the development of relevant applications.

- MoS E&IT launches India's 1st indigenous server RUDRA Rajeev Chandrasekhar also launched India's 1st indigenous Server, RUDRA, which was developed by the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (CDAC) under the National Supercomputing Mission (NSM) supported by MeiTY and DST (Department of Science & Technology).
- C-DAC is collaborating with Intel, NVIDIA (technology partners), and ATOS (manufacturing partner).
- MoS announced the top 10 winning teams of the Swadeshi Microprocessor Challenge, which was announced in August 2020 to provide further thrust to the Start-up, innovation and research in India.
- Under the aegis of Microprocessor Development Programme of MeitY, a powerpack indigenously developed processors such as SHAKTI (by IIT Madras) and VEGA (by C-DAC) has been developed from scratch using Open-Source Architecture.

PM Narendra Modi Inaugurated, lays Foundation Stone for Multiple Projects in Dehradun

O n December 4, 2021, Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi inaugurated 7 projects worth Rs 2,573 crore and laid the foundation stone of 11 projects worth Rs 15,728 crore in Dehradun, Uttarakhand (Cumulatively the projects worth around Rs 18,000 crore).

- Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami also participated in the project's inauguration.
- More than Rs 1 lakh crore has been approved by the Centre in the last five years for the development of Uttarakhand.

About some of the Key Projects :

Delhi-Dehradun Economic Corridor:

- PM laid the foundation stone for the Delhi-Dehradun Economic Corridor project, which will be built at a cost of around Rs 8,300 crore.
- It will have Asia's largest wildlife elevated corridor (12 kilometres) for unrestricted wildlife movement. It also includes the 340 metres long tunnel near Dat Kaali temple, Dehradun to reduce the impact on wildlife.
- Dehradun Paonta Sahib, Himachal Pradesh road project: PM Modi laid the foundation stone for the Dehradun - Paonta Sahib (Himachal Pradesh) road project, being constructed at a cost of around Rs 1700 crore.

India-ITU Launch Joint Cyber Drill 2021

The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) operating under the Ministry of Communications conducted a 'Joint Cyber Drill 2021'. It was conducted for the Critical Network Infrastructure (CNI) operators of India.

 It is a four-day virtual event that will take place from November 30 to December 3, 2021.

- ii. It will improve the cyber security readiness of India and also helps to test an organization's cyber capabilities against cyber-attacks, information security incidents, and other disruptions in our country.

Gol to Develop Indigenous Jet Engines for LCA Tejas Aircrafts

he Government of India (Gol) has informed the Parliament about the future development of indigenous engines for powering aircraft such as Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas variants and Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA) in association with an International Engine House. Currently, the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas is integrated with an imported engine.

The LCA Tejas, Flight Operational Clearance (FOC) configuration requires higher thrust than the intended engine requirement. Thus the present architecture of the Kaveri engine cannot be integrated with LCA Tejas.

22nd Hornbill Festival begins in Nagaland



On 1 December 2021, The 22 nd Hornbill Festival began in Nagaland at Naga Heritage Village, Kisama(Kohima). The Governor of Assam and Nagaland Prof. Jagdish Mukhi inaugurated the programme of the 10-day festival. It is also called the 'Festival of Festivals'.

- It is the largest celebration of the Indigenous Warrior Tribes of Nagaland, generally celebrated for 10 days.
- The festival is also known as Dhanesh bird festival. Organized by the State Tourism and Art & Culture Departments.

Objective :

- To revive and protect the rich culture of Nagaland and display its extravaganza and traditions.
- To encourage inter-tribal interaction and to promote cultural heritage of Nagaland.

Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia Announced New Helicopter Policy to set up Dedicated Hubs and Corridors

J yotiraditya M. Scindia, Union Minister of Civil Aviation has announced a New 10point(Step) Helicopter Policy at the 3rd Helicopter Summit 2021 - India@75: Expediting the Growth of Indian Helicopter Industry and Enhancing Air Connectivity organised by FICCI (Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry), Ministry of Civil Aviation(MoCA) and Pawan Hans Ltd. in Dehradun, Uttarakhand.

- Under this new policy dedicated hubs and corridors will be established to boost air connectivity. Initially four Heli Hubs and Training Units will be set up Juhu in Mumbai, Guwahati, Delhi, and Bangalore.
- He also stated that 10 cities and 82 routes were identified to develop helicopter corridors.

Features of the New Policy :

- Under this policy, the landing charges and parking deposits were abolished to boost commercial operations.
- As a part of the new policy, the government will also form a dedicated helicopter acceleration cell in the Ministry of Civil Aviation, which will monitor the issues of the helicopter industry.
- An advisory group will also be formed under the Ministry to discuss the difficulties faced by the helicopter industry.

PM Modi Inaugurated thought Leadership Forum on FinTech- 'Infinity Forum'

In December 2021, Prime Minister Narendra Modi virtually inaugurated a thought leadership forum on FinTech, 'InFinity Forum'.

The event was hosted by International Financial Services Centres Authority (IFSCA), under the aegis of the Government of India in collaboration with GIFT City and Bloomberg on December 3 and 4,2021.

Indonesia, South Africa and the United Kingdom were the partner countries in the 1 st edition of the Forum.

These Vessels have been designed and developed by Defence Public Sector Undertaking (DPSU), Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE). iii. It was launched by Smt Pushpa Bhatt, spouse of Ajay Bhatt, by chanting invocation from Atharva Veda. It is a Naval Maritime Tradition of launching new vessels.

The contract for building four survey ships is priced at Rs 2435 Crs. It was signed between MoD and GRSE on Oct 30,2018.

India Skills Report 2022: Maharashtra Retains Top Position for Most Employable Talent

As per the 9th edition of India Skills Report (ISR) 2022, released by Wheebox, Maharashtra has retained the top position in the list of states wit the highest poll of employable talent followed by Uttar Pradesh and Kerala

- The theme of ISR 2022 'Rebuilding and Reengineering the Future of Work'.
- States with Maximum Hiring Activity: Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu are the 3 states that have a higher job demand.
- Pune is the city with the most highly employable resources with 78% of the test takers scoring above 60 percent.
- As per the current edition, the overall employability in India has improved with 46.2 of the youth being found to be highly employable compared to last year's employability standing at 45.97.

NITI Aayog releases report on Country Level Status of Emergency and Injury Care in India

O n 10th December 2021 National Institute of Transforming India (NITI Aayog) released two comprehensive reports titled - Reports on current status on Country level (secondary \& tertiary level) and district level emergency and injury care in India.

 These reports were launched in the presence of Dr V K Paul, Hon'ble Member (Health) NITI Aayog and Dr Rakesh Sarwal, Additional Secretary, and other dignitaries. These studies were carried out by the department of Emergency Medicine, Jai Prakash Narayan Apex Trauma Centre (JPNATC), All India Institute of Medical Science (AIIMS), New Delhi in collaboration with NITI Aayog.

Highlights :

Prevailing gaps in ambulance services, health infrastructure, human resources and equipment in the provision of optimal care.

NEDFi Introduced Atmanirbhar Hastshilpkar Scheme for North Eastern Artisans

On December 09, 2021, the North Eastern Development Finance Corporation Ltd. (NEDFi), a premier financial institution in the North-Eastern (NE) Region, has introduced a new scheme named Atmanirbhar Hastshilpkar Scheme to the grass-root Artisans of the NE region under the Ministry of Doner (Development of NE Region).

Objective: To develop the petty artisans of the NE Region by providing financial assistance in the form of term loans for income-generating activities for setting up/expansion/modernization/working capital requirement and other activities related to the sector.

Key Points :

- Under the launch of the scheme, around 17 artisans have been provided with credit assistance of Rs 1 lakh per artisan.
- The credit facility is collateral-free and carries a subsidized interest rate of \$\mathbf{6}\$ percent per annum which is repayable in 24 months.

- On regular repayment, an incentive of 1 percent on the interest rate will be refunded to the artisans (on successful repayment of loans).
- Eligibility : The artisan should have a valid qualification or practice of any art form and the individual should not have an existing loan from any other bank/ financial institution.

ISRO, Oppo India Collaborates to Strengthen R&D of NavIC Messaging Service

A n agreement has been inked between the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and the Chinese smart devices maker Oppo's Indian arm to strengthen the Research and Development (R&D) of the NavIC messaging service, an Indian satellite navigation system.

 NaviC, an acronym for Navigation with Indian Constellation, aims to provide a user-friendly platform.

What is in the agreement?

- As a part of pact, Oppo India will support ISRO with its R&D capabilities to provide a seamless experience to the users of the NavIC application.
- There will be an exchange of technical information between ISRO and Oppo.
- Oppo will also use NavIC messaging service in its future mobile handset sold in India.
- This agreement will also enable both entities for future collaborations to develop indigenous solutions.
- What is NavIC?

- It is the regional geo-positioning system designed in India by ISRO to provide accurate PNT (Position, Navigation, and Timing) of the Indian mainland and an area up to 1500km beyond the Indian mainland. It is equivalent to American GPS (Global Positioning System), Russia's Glonass and Galileo developed by Europe.
- NavIC is also capable of broadcasting short messages/safety-of-life alerts in areas with poor or no communication, particularly in the oceans.
- Also, NavIC is powered by dual frequency (S and L) while GPS is dependent only on \$L\$ band making it more accurate than GPS.

Points to be noted :

- Oppo phones currently have GPS and Beidou global positioning services.
- Currently, Xiaomi is the only company to have used the NaviC on its phones.
- It collaborated with ISRO for the same in 2020.
- The Redmi Note 9 series and the Redmi Note
 10 Lite also support NavIC navigation.

MoD signs MoU with IITE, Gandhinagar for Training 800 Sainik School Teachers

On December 10, 2021, the Ministry of Defence (MoD) has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Indian Institute of Teacher Education (IITE), Gandhinagar to facilitate training for 800 teachers of Sainik Schools.

 The MoU is signed for 5 years with effect from January 2022. Under the partnership, around more than 800 teachers from all Sainik Schools will be trained through courses named 'Gurudiksha' and 'Pratibaddhta'.

The MoU was signed in New Delhi by Rakesh Mittal, Joint Secretary (Land & Works) and Honorary Secretary, Sainik Schools Society (SSS), (on behalf of MoD); and Himanshu Patel, Registrar of IITE.

This challenge will explore innovative and commercially viable solutions to address six problems faced by the animal husbandry and dairy sector.

Note :

 An Umiya Mata temple was also commissioned by the Kadva Patidar Samaj in Macon, Georgia, in 2013.

Key Highlights:

- The Laying foundation stone of the Umiya Mata temple and other buildings were conducted as a 3-day ceremony starting from 11th December 2021.
- They will be developed at a cost of Rs 1,500 crore on 74,000 square yards of land.

The MoU was signed by Air Vice Marshal Samir V Borade, Deputy Senior Maintenance Staff Officer, Headquarters Maintenance Command, IAF, and M R Ravi, Head of Department for Mechanical Engineering at IIT-Delhi.

Key Points:

- Under the MoU, The IAF has identified key focus areas involving development of technology and finding indigenous solutions towards sustenance of various weapon systems.



G7 Finance Leaders set Guidelines for CBDCs

G⁷ (Group of Seven) advanced economies' central banks have been working to set common standards toward issuing 'Central Bank Digital Currency' (CBDC).

As per the statement of G7, any CBDC issued by a central bank should not harm the bank's ability to fulfill its mandate on monetary and financial stability, and also should meet the standards.

What is CBDC?

- A CBDC is a legal tender that would be issued by the central bank in a digital form. It is exchangeable one-to-one with fiat currency and it would appear as a liability (currency in circulation) on a central bank's balance sheet.
- A CBDC would complement cash and could act like a liquid, safe settlement asset and an anchor for the payments system.

G7's Statement on CBDC:

- Any CBDC should be grounded in longstanding public commitments to transparency, rule of law and sound economic governance
- The currencies must be issued in a way that does not violate the central banks' mandates and meet rigorous standards of privacy, transparency and accountability for the protection of user data.
- CBDCs could enhance cross-border payments and minimize harmful spillovers to the international monetary and financial system. Currently, China has been leading toward issuing a digital currency.

Note :

World Malaria Report 2021: Worldwide Malaria Cases in 2020 Estimated at 241 million

A ccording to WHO's (World Health Organisation) latest World Malaria Report 2021, globally there were an estimated 241 million malaria cases and 627000 malaria deaths in 85 malaria-endemic countries in 2020, increasing from 227 million in 2019.

 As per the report, there are about 14 million more cases in 2020 compared to 2019 and 69000 more deaths.

Key Points :

- Globally, India accounts for \$1.7\$ percent of malaria deaths in 2020. As per the report, India was the only high-burden country to have sustained a reduction in the disease burden.
- South-East Asia: India shares over 83 percent of the malaria cases and 82 percent of all malaria deaths in the WHO South-East Asia Region, from about 18 cases per 1000 population at risk in 2000 to about 3 cases in 2020.
- In 2021, WHO certified two countries -China and El Salvador - as malaria free, and a further 25 are on track to end malaria transmission by 2025.

UNGA granted Observer Status to International Solar Alliance

The United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) granted Observer Status to International Solar Alliance (ISA) by adopting resolution 76/123. This decision has been taken based on the UNGA's Sixth Committee report. In November 2015, ISA was jointly launched by India and France during the 21st session of the United Nations Climate Change COP-21 in Paris, France to promote solar energy among its Member Countries.

India Assumed the Chairmanship of Council of Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure of SCO

India assumed the Chairmanship of Council of Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure of Shanghai Cooperation Organization (RATS SCO) for 1 year from October 28,2021.

The National Security Council Secretariat (NSCS), Government of India, in association with Data Security Council of India (DSCI), as a Knowledge Partner, organized a 2-day Practical Seminar on 'Securing Cyberspace in the Contemporary Threat Environment' (on December 7 and 8, 2021) for delegates from SCO member States.

- The seminar is the 1st event to be hosted by India during its Chairmanship of Council of RATS SCO.
- This is the second time India is hosting such the Seminar event. At 1st time the seminar was held in Hyderabad, India in August 2019 and it was not held in 2020 due to COVID-19.

Key Points :

- The Seminar addressed the key areas like Policies and Strategies, Cyber Terrorism, Ransomware, and Digital Forensics amongst others.
- The program focused on the changing nature of online crime and criminal behaviour in order to understand the threats, trends, issues, responses and ethical questions

associated with, mainly terrorists using technology.

- The Seminar provided Hands-on Practical experience to the participants to enhance the capabilities of respective Law Enforcement Agencies in securing cyberspace from Terrorism, Separatism and Extremism.
- It also examined issues related to the cyberrealm from an interdisciplinary and multidimensional perspective.
- The event acted as effort of India to improve the collaboration among RATS SCO Member States to overcome the misuse of internet by Terrorists, Separatists and Extremists.
- Participants: The representatives from the Executive Committee (EC) of RATS SCO and all SCO member countries participated in the Seminar.

India ranked 66th at the Global Health Security Index 2021; USA Tops

A s per the Global Health Security (GHS) Index 2021 , the world's average overall GHS Index score was reduced to 38.9 (out of 100) in 2021, from a score of 40.2 in the GHS Index, 2019. India ranked 66 out of 195 countries with an overall Index score of 42.8 and along with a change of \$-0.8\$ from 2019

- The United States of America (USA) ranked 1st on the index with a score of \$75.9\$ followed by Australia and Finland.
- No countries scored in the top tier (no country scored above 75.9) of the GHS index, with 58 percent of countries scoring below average for rapid response to and mitigation of the spread of an epidemic.

Note :

 India ranked 57th in the GHS Index 2019 with a score of 46.5 out of 100.

About GHS Index :

It is an assessment and benchmarking of health security and related capabilities across 195 countries. It is developed in partnership with the Nuclear Threat Initiative (NTI) and the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security at the Bloomberg School of Public Health. It was 1st launched in October 2019.

India re-elected to International Maritime Organization Council for 2022-2023



INTERNATIONAL MARITIME ORGANIZATION

India has been re-elected to International Maritime Organisation (IMO) Council for the 2022-2023 biennium under category B states.

- The Assembly of the International Maritime Organization has elected the Members of its Council for the 2022-2023 biennium.
- The Council is the executive organ of IMO and is responsible, under the Assembly, for supervising the work of the Organization.
- The Council performs the functions of the Assembly, except that of making recommendations to Governments on maritime safety and pollution prevention.

Candidates for IMO Council :

Category (a) 10 States with the largest interest in providing international shipping services:

- China, Greece, Italy, Japan, Norway, Panama, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and United States.

- India, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, France, Germany, Netherlands, Spain, Sweden, United Arab Emirates.

Bahamas, Bangladesh, Belgium, Chile, Colombia, Cyprus, Denmark, Egypt, Indonesia, Jamaica, Kenya, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA), Malaysia, Malta, Mexico, Morocco, Nigeria, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Qatar, Singapore, South Africa, Thailand, Turkey, Vanuatu.

The newly elected Council will meet, following the conclusion of the 32nd Assembly, for its 126th session (on December 15) and will elect its Chair and Vice-Chair for the next biennium.

UNICEF: COVID-19 Biggest Global Crisis to Child Progress in UNICEF's 75 Years

O n the occasion of the 75th anniversary of the UNICEF(United Nations Children's Fund), UNICEF released a report titled "Preventing a

lost decade: Urgent action to reverse the devastating impact of COVID-19 on children and young people.

- The report states that children were most affected due to the COVID-19 pandemic, making this the biggest threat to progress for children in our 75-year history.
- The report outlines our current work by taking into account the ongoing impact of COVID-19 on children and the response and recovery path for each child in the future.

Problems of COVID-19:

- Without proper action, the world will face a lost decade for children, leaving the Sustainable Development Goals an impossible dream.
- In less than 2 years around 100 million children have fallen into poverty, this is around 10% increase since 2019.

Dangers:

Before the COVID-19 pandemic, around 1 billion children across the globe and around 50 % of all the children in developing countries, suffered at least one severe deprivation without access to minimum levels of education, health, housing, nutrition, sanitation, or water.

Response:

- To respond and recover and reimagine the future for every child, UNICEF calls for,
- Investing in social protection, human capital and spending for an inclusive and resilient recovery

- Ending the pandemic and reversing the alarming rollback in child health and nutrition
- Building back stronger by ensuring quality education, protection and good mental health for every child
- Building resilience to better prevent, respond to and protect children from crises.

Key Points:

- There are more than 60 million children are living in monetary poor households, and more than 23 million have missed out on essential vaccines, the highest number in more than decade.
- Schools around the globe were closed for almost \$80 \%\$ of in-person instruction time during the 1st year
- Due to the global pandemic, more than \$1.6\$
 billion students were put out of school.
- Mental health conditions affect more than 13 per cent of adolescents aged 10-19 worldwide. By October 2020, the pandemic had disrupted or halted critical mental health services in 93 per cent of countries worldwide.

- The summit focuses on challenges and opportunities facing democracies and will provide a platform for leaders to announce both individual and collective commitments, reforms, and initiatives to defend democracy and human rights at home and abroad.

Key Points:

- Joe Biden highlighted the 'definite challenges' and threats faced by democracy worldwide that has been 'backsliding'.
- The second Leaders' Plenary Session was hosted by the President of the European Commission, Ursula von der Leyen.
- PM Modi stated about India's democratic civilization and suggested ways to improve the democratic rule across nations. He also emphasised the need for democratic countries to deliver the values and ethos of their constitutions.
- He also outlined sensitivity, accountability, participation and reform orientation as four pillars of Indian democratic governance.
- He stressed that principles of democracy should also guide global governance; and that given technology's ability to impact democracy positively or negatively, technology companies should contribute to preserving open and democratic societies.

UAE Became the 1st Country to Transition to 4 and Half-day Work Week

The United Arab Emirates (UAE) has announced to change its 5-day work-week to a 4 and a half day starting from 1st January 2022 and became the first country to make the employee-friendly transition as part of its efforts to improve productivity and work-life balance.

New Schedule: Monday to Thursday the work timings would be from 7.30 am to 3.30 pm followed by a half-day on Friday from 7.30 am to 12.00 pm & Saturdays and Sundays are full-day holidays.

Dubai becomes World's 1st 100% Paperless Govt



In December 2021, Dubai became the world's first government to turn 100 percent paperless, the announcement was made by the United Arab Emirate (UAE) Crown Prince, Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum.

It will save around 3 billion Dirham (USD 350 million) and 14-million-man hours.

Key Points :

- A comprehensive digital government services platform is managing all internal, external transactions and procedures of the Government of Dubai.
- The Dubai Paperless Strategy was implemented in five consecutive phases, each entity consisting of a different group of the Dubai Government's entities.

- By the end of the fifth phase, the strategy was fully implemented across all 45 government entities in the emirate.
- All the entities provide more than 1,800 digital services and over 10,500 key transactions.
- All the exceptional digital services can be accessed by the Citizens through "DubaiNow application".
- The digitization will provide all the govt. services to customers \& reduce paper consumption by more than 336 million papers.

Current Generation Students could lose 14% of Global GDP due to COVID-19 induced School Closure

A s per the report of the World Bank (WB), titled, 'The State of the Global Education Crisis: A Path to Recovery', the present generation of students' risks losing USD 17 trillion (higher than the 2020 estimation of USD 10 trillion) in lifetime earnings in present value, or about 14 percent of today's global GDP (Gross Domestic Product) due to COVID-19-related school closures The report was prepared by WB in collaboration with UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) and UNICEF (United Nations Children's Fund).

Key Points :

- In low- and middle-income countries, the share of children living in Learning Poverty (which is already over 50 percent before the COVID-19) has increased up to 70 percent, given the long school closures and the varying quality and effectiveness of remote learning.
- COVID-19 has brought education systems across the world to a halt, with school closures affecting more than 1.6 billion learners.
- More than 370 million children globally missed out on school meals during school closures, losing what is for some children the only reliable source of food and daily nutrition.
- In rural Karnataka, the share of grade 3 children in government schools able to perform simple subtraction fell from 24 percent in 2018 to only 16 percent in 2020.

WHO Report on 3 Diseases: State of Inequalities-HIV, TB and Malaria

The World Health Organization (WHO) and the Global Fund released titled 'State of Inequalities - HIV, Tuberculosis and Malaria', stating that the poorest, least-educated and rural subgroups remain vulnerable to Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), Tuberculosis (TB) and malaria.

 The report takes a look at 32 health indicators from 186 countries on HIV, TB and malaria. India's average on prevention of HIV, TB and malaria have improved in the past decade.

Aim :

 To document and understand the relation between inequalities and the fight against HIV, TB and malaria that kill more than 2 million people every year.

Note :

People living with HIV accounted for 8 percent of new TB infections in 2020. Moreover, \$1.3\$ million, who were HIV negative have died of TB, while 214,000 people living with HIV were affected with TB.

Past Missions:

In the recent 100 launches, the Long March rockets have taken up quality missions like the launch of China's Tianhe space station core module, Shenzhou manned spacecraft, Chang'e-5 lunar probe and the country's first interplanetary Tianwen-1 Mars exploration mission.

Background :

 According to the rocket developers with the state-owned space giant China Aerospace Science and Technology Corporation (CASC), the first 100 launches took place over 37 years, the second 100 launches took seven and half years, the third took four years and three months, and the fourth only took two years and nine months.

ADB trims Developing Asia's Growth Forecasts over Omicron Risks

I nits Asian Development Outlook Supplement Report of December 2021, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) has trimmed the growth forecasts for developing Asia for 2021-2022 to reflect the economic impact and uncertainty caused by the new Omicron COVID -19 variant.

- ADB marks the 2021 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth projection of developing Asia to 7 percent, down from its earlier projection of \$7.1\$ percent (September 2021), and 2022 growth to 5.3 percent, down from 5.4 percent.
- India: The ADB trimmed its 2021 growth forecast for India to 9.7 percent from the 10 percent but left the 2022 growth forecast unchanged at \$7.5\$ percent.

Inflation :

 The inflation forecast of developing Asia was revised to \$2.1\$ percent for 2021 and unchanged at 2.7 percent for 2022.

Pakistan successfully test-fires enhanced range version of Babur Cruise Missile 1B

O n December 21,2021, Pakistan successfully test-fired an enhanced range version of its indigenously-built surface-to-surface Babur cruise missile namely 'Babur Cruise Missile 1B' that can strike targets up to 900 kilometers from 450 Km of former missile.

- The Babur missile is capable of engaging targets at land and sea with high precision.
- The launch ceremony of Babur Cruise Missile 1B was witnessed by Lt Gen Nadeem Zaki Manj, Director General, Strategic Plans Division; Dr Raza Samar, Chairman National Engineering and Scientific Commission (NESCOM); among others.

Key Points :

- The missile is named after Mughal King Babur who laid the foundations of the Mughal Empire in the sub-continent in 1526.
- In February 2021, Pakistan conducted a successful training launch of the earlier version of Babar cruise
- In August 2021, it conducted a successful test flight of Fatah-1 which is a guided multilaunch rocket system capable of delivering conventional warheads.

KUFOS to Join Research Project under NASA-ISRO Collaborative Programme

IEA Report: Coal Demand Forecasted to Grow by 6% in 2021; way off to Achieve Net Zero

A sper the report of the International Energy Agency (IEA) titled Coal 2021 Analysis and forecast to 2024, overall global coal demand is expected to grow by 6 percent in 2021 with coal consumption to 7,906 million tonnes (Mt) and is set to rise to 8025 MT in 2022, the highest level ever.

Key Points of the Report :

- The global coal power generation is expected to increase by 9 percent in 2021 to 10,350 terawatt-hours (TWh).
- CO2 emissions from coal in 2024 are expected to be well over 3 gigatonnes higher than in the Net Zero Emissions by 2050 Scenario.
- Due to Covid-19 total coal consumption declined 4.4 percent in 2020, to 7,456 Mt and the Coal use for power production also dropped by 4.2 percent.
- According to IEA, coal power generation is set to increase by almost 20 percent in 2021 in the United States and the European Union (but that would not be enough to take it above 2019 levels).
- In 2020, China's share in global coal consumption increased to 53 percent. As

China and India (12 percent) together account for roughly two-thirds of world coal use.

Note :

China is the world's largest consumer, producer and Importer of coal followed by India being the 2nd largest producer, consumer and importer.

Japan launches Inmarsat-6 F1 Communications Satellite into Geostationary Orbit

Japan has launched Inmarsat-6-F1, a communication satellite, through a Mitsubishi Heavy Industries' (MHI) H-IIA204 rocket from Japan's Tanegashima Space Center that will enter geostationary orbit, about 22,240 miles (35,790 kilometers) above earth.

- It is developed by the London-based company Inmarsat as a part of its next generation satellite broadband service.
- The satellite is 12,060 -pound (5,470 kilograms) and is the first of two 'I-6' spacecraft.

Key Points :

- Designated H-IIAF45, Inmarsat-6 F1 launch is Japan's third orbital flight of 2021 and H-IIA's second mission of the year, marking the 45th flight of the H-IIA vehicle overall.
- It is dual-payload satellites featuring both Lband (ELERA) and Ka-band (Global Xpress).
- It is the world's largest and most sophisticated commercial communications satellite ever launched.
- H-IIA is Japan's longest-serving liquid-fueled rocket (since 2001) and currently largest rocket operated by MHI for the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA)

China Launches New Camera Satellite 'Ziyuan-1 O2E' to Find Resources

O n 26th December 2021, the China National Space Administration (CNSA) stated about China's launch of a new satellite with a highresolution camera that can take pictures of the ground with a resolution of 5 meters.

The satellite, named 'Ziyuan-1 02E' or 'fivemeter optical satellite 02' was launched by a Long March-4C rocket from the Taiyuan Satellite Launch Centre in north China's Shanxi province.

About 'Ziyuan-1 02E' or 'five-meter optical satellite 02':

- The Ziyuan-1 02E weighs about 2.5 kilograms and it is equipped with infrared, nearinfrared and hyperspectral cameras that can take full-colour panchromatic images of the Earth.
- Pictures taken by the satellites will help engineers survey China's geological environment and search for minerals.
- It also helps in other areas like transportation, agriculture and disaster mitigation.
- The satellite will work with the 5-meter optical satellite 01 and shorten the revisit time of Chinese territory from three days to two days.

Highlights :

- The Long March-4C carrier rocket also sent a small satellite that belongs to Beijing 101 Middle School into orbit.
- It carries payloads such as a small imaging camera, intelligent processing equipment, and equipment for conducting experiments

on semiconductor thermoelectric generation, state-run Xinhua.

 It will carry out auxiliary geography teaching, scientific and technological experiments and other popular science activities for middle school students.

NASA's James Webb Space Telescope Launched from French Guiana, South America



On December 25,2021, NASA's (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) James Webb Space Telescope (JWST), an infrared telescope, launched through the Arianespace's heavy-lift Ariane 5 rocket from the European Space Agency's (ESA) spaceport in Kourou, French Guiana, on South America's northeast coast.

- It is named after James Edwin Webb, one of the architects of the Apollo Moon programme.
- It will be positioned at a spot called Lagrange Point 2 (L2) 1.5 million kilometre from earth or more than four times beyond the moon.
- Its commissioning in space will take 6 months.
 The mission span is between 5-15 years.

Russia Test-fires New Hypersonic Tsirkon Missiles from Frigate and Submarine

O n 31 December 2021, Russia successfully test-fired around 10 new Tsirkon (Zircon) hypersonic cruise missiles from a frigate and other two missiles from a submarine.

Key Points :

- The Zircon missile would be capable of flying at nine times the speed of sound and have a range of 1,000 kilometres (620 miles).
- The deployment of the missiles will elevate the capability of Russia's military power.

About Tsirkon (Zircon) Hypersonic Cruise Missile:

- The Tsirkon Cruise Missile will join Avangard glide vehicles and the air-launched Kinzhal (Dagger) missiles in Russia's hypersonic arsenal.
- Cruise missiles differ from ballistic missiles in that they fly towards their target at lower altitudes, remaining within the Earth's atmosphere throughout their trajectory.
- It is one of the several missiles being developed in Russia that will arm up Russian submarines, frigates, and cruisers.
- Hypersonic Weapons are much harder to track and intercept than traditional projectiles because they can travel more than five times the speed of sound and maneuver in mid-flight.

Shanghai Opened 2 Driverless Metro Lines; Becomes Longest Metro Line in the World



S hanghai, the biggest city in China, has opened 2 new driverless metro lines (Line 14

and Phase One of Line 18) and retained its titles as the World's longest Metro line. With the inclusion of the 2 new driverless lines, the total length of Shanghai's metro network is extended to 831 km.

Shanghai Metro Network :

- The 2 new fully driverless metro lines take the total number of automatic lines in Shanghai to 5.
- At present Shanghai operates of fully automated metro lines, which makes the city the first in the World.
- Line 14 of the Shanghai metro network which operates for 38 km, is the first fully automatic metro line for 8-car trains in the city.
- With the inclusion of the 2 new metro lines, Shanghai now has 20 metro lines with 508 stations.

Key Points :

 Shanghai is followed by Beijing (China) and Delhi(India) in the 2 nd and 3 rd spot on the list of cities with the largest metro network. Beijing has about 780 km long metro lines with 450 stations.

New Coronavirus Variant Named IHU Discovered in France

The Scientists of France have discovered a new variant of the Coronavirus, named IHU - B.1.640.2 variant. The new variant named IHU was discovered by the academics at the institute IHU Mediterranean Infection, Marseille, France.

- IHU variant contains 46 mutations (more than the Omicron) and 37 deletions resulting in 30 amino acid substitutions and 12 deletions.
- IHU (B.1.640.2) has not been spotted in other countries or labelled a variant under investigation by the World Health Organization (WHO).

JC Chaudhry gets first ever Guinness World Record in Numerology

ndia's one of the top numerologists, JC L Chaudhry has achieved the firstever Guinness World Record in Numerology and the first world record of 2022 by educating about ancient science to around 6000 participants, numerology enthusiasts of joined from the United States, the United Kingdom, Middle East, and India. He has also directed movies such as 'Mask', 'At Long Last Love' and 'Daisy Miller.'

Antigua and Barbuda joined ISA as the 102nd member

The Caribbean nation of Antigua and Barbuda joined the International Solar Alliance (ISA) as the 102nd member by signing the International Solar Alliance Framework Agreement, the India-led global green energy initiative. The Prime Minister of Antigua and Barbuda, Gaston Browne signed the framework agreement in the presence of Indian High Commissioner Dr K. J. Srinivasa to catalyze global energy transition through a solar-led approach.
